Price Matching

What is price matching?

Price matching is a policy set by some retailers that stipulates if you find the same item at a lower cost, they'll match or beat the price.



What grocery stores in London price match?

Real Canadian Superstore

Price Matching

How does price matching work?

REAL CANADIAN SUPERSTORE

Great Canadian Superstore will match prices if you show a lower advertised price from a major supermarket competitor on any identical item, up to a limit of four (4) units per item during the effective dates of that competitor's advertisement.



FreshCo offers a lowest price guarantee, meaning that if a supermarket competitor offers a lower price on an item carried in store, FreshCo will sell the item for one cent less than the competitor's advertised price.



No Frills will price match any advertised products from a major supermarket competitor in the same area.

Note: When price matching, it is important to ensure that you are price matching an identical item to receive the deal. You must bring proof of the lower price in the form of a digital or online flyer to the cashier. Individual store policies may vary.

Flipp and Reebee are apps that provides latest weekly ads, deals, and coupons from local grocery stores.

Shoppers can use the FlashFood app on their phone to see what food has been discounted as it is nearing its best before date, pay for the items, and then pick them up in the FlashFood "zone" of their participating store.

Money Saving Apps

Food Keeper



The Food Keeper app helps you find storage times for common foods in your pantry, fridge and freezer to help you waste less food. There are also cooking tips to help keep your foods safe.

Sale Whale



Sale Whale is an app that helps you price match grocery items, find local coupons and flyers, and look up what grocery stores in your area have certain food items on sale.

Checkout 51



Checkout 51 is an app that allows you to get Cash Back when you shop at participating grocery stores in Canada. After buying products, you upload a picture of your receipt to the app. When your account balance reaches \$20, you can cash out and they will mail you a check.

The London Good Food Box is a program of London's Child and Youth Network which distributes low-cost boxes of vegetables and fruit once a month in neighbourhoods across London. For \$14, you will receive \$20-22 worth of fresh produce, as well as healthy tips for preserving and preparing your fruits and vegetables. Orders and payments are generally due one week in advance of pick-up and pick-ups are scheduled for end of the month. Each location may have it's own dates for payment/pick up. There are 18 locations in London participating. See FAQ on website.

Food Fund is a food subscription box that sources recovered produce from grocers and delivers it to your front door. Food Fund is a no commitment service with weekly deliveries and cancellation available at any time. Boxes are customizable and have a minimum order amount of \$25 + \$2.99-\$3.99 delivery fee. Deliveries are on Fridays and Saturdays between 10:00am and 6:00pm.

Note: Frequency of food bank access

London Food Bank - Individuals and families are allowed to visit for help once a month (every 30 days).

Salvation Army Food Bank - Individuals and families are eligible for access nine times per year, no more than once per month.

Meals on Wheels



Meals on Wheels (MOW) delivers nutritious and affordable meals to seniors, those with disabilities, and those who need special dietary planning and assistance.

How does Meals on Wheels work?

- Fresh and frozen meal options available.
- Daily meals are delivered Monday to Friday from 11:00 am-1:30 pm.
- Weekend meals are delivered chilled on Friday. Frozen meal delivery is usually Thursday morning.
- The minimum order on registration is either five daily meals or one package of seven frozen meals.
- Clients are billed monthly (online or over the phone).
- No long-term contract is required.
- Subsidized meal prices available with proof of income.

BGC Meal Delivery



Boys & Girls Club of London

The Boys and Girls Club (BGC) of London provides a 17 different nutritious and affordable frozen entree options available for pickup and delivery.

How does BGC meal delivery work?

- Frozen meal entrees available for online order.
- Price: \$7.50 each serving with additional flat rate fee of \$5.00 for a minimum order of 6 meals or more to one local address.
- Payment can be made online or over the phone. Exact cash is accepted at pickup.
- Curbside pickup also available.
- Accommodates dietary restrictions (i.e. vegetarian, vegan, glutenfree and dairy-free).

Scanning code of practice

The Scanning Code of Practice (SCOP) is a voluntary code that allows you to get a discount if an item you are buying is scanned incorrectly.

If a participating retailer scans an item at checkout, and the price appears higher than the advertised price or the price that is displayed in the store, you can get a discount on the item you are buying. For example, if the item you are buying has an advertised price of \$19.99 and it scans as \$20.00, you can get a discount.

All grocery stores in Canada must participate in the scanning code of practice.

According to the SCOP:

- If an item that was incorrectly scanned costs \$10 or less, you can get this product for free.
- If an item that was incorrectly scanned costs \$10 or more, you can get a discount of \$10.

Buying foods using the unit price

What is unit price?

Unit pricing tells you how much you're paying per basic unit of the item you're buying. If you're buying paper towels, the unit price is the price per square foot. For toilet paper, the unit price might be the price per sheet. For canned goods, it might be the price per ounce.

How do I find the unit price of an item?

To find the unit price of an item, look on the tag for the item on the grocery store shelf. Not sure exactly what you're looking for on the tag itself? Take a look at the red highlighted section of the food label below.



Buying foods using the unit price

How can using the unit price help me save money?

By buying products with a cheaper unit price, you are choosing the product that is the better value per unit of product which will save you money in the long-term.

How can I calculate unit price at the grocery store?

To calculate unit price, divide the retail/shelf price by the number of units of the item. For example, to find the unit price of a 12 ounce can of soup that costs \$2.40, divide \$2.40 by 12 ounces, to get unit price of soup as \$0.20 per ounce.



Retail price: \$2.40

\$2.40

Size of can (units): 12 oz 12 oz

\$0.20 per oz

Choosing off-brands

Choosing generic, off-brands at the grocery store can help you save money as off-brands are typically cheaper than brand name products and still very high quality.

Some examples of generic brands to purchase at the grocery store include:













Loyalty programs

Loyalty programs allow companies to offer points or benefits to customers. In return, they can redeem points for discounts, free products, rewards, or insider perks.



PC Optimum

The PC Optimum program allows you to collect and redeem points when shopping major grocery stores.

Participating grocery stores: Loblaws, No Frills, Real Canadian Superstore, Fortinos, Independent, Valu-Mart and Zehrs.



Scene+

Scene+ allows you to collect and redeem points at participating stores and Cineplex theatres in Ontario.

Participating grocery stores: Sobeys, Safeway, Foodland, FreshCo, Thrifty Foods, IGA and Rachelle Béry.



Airmiles

Scene+ allows you to collect and redeem points at participating stores as well as access weekly in-store offers.

Participating grocery stores: Metro

Seniors and student days

Many stores in the London are hold seniors days and student days where discounts are provided for individuals 65+ or students.

Seniors discount days in London:

- **Bulk Barn:** Offers a 10% discount to all seniors every Wednesday (65+)
- M & M Meats: Offers 5% on Tuesdays 10% if you spend more than \$30
- Shoppers Drug Mart: Seniors save 20% every Thursday

Student discount days in London:

Seven main grocery stores in London offer a 10% off student discount on Tuesdays, including:

- Sobeys
- Loblaws
- Valu-mart
- Real Canadian Superstore
- United
- Metro
- Food Basics

United Supermarket also offers student discounts every Wednesday and Metro has student discounts on Wednesday and Thursday.



Use unit prices when shopping to compare sizes of products and brands.



Check the reduced price shelf for cheap prices on produce.



Buy meat at a discount price (i.e. Metro has deals on Tuesdays).



Take advantage of seniors and student discount days.



Watch the prices you're charged at the register for mistakes.



Choose a reusable water bottle and fill it with tap water.
